Words of Wisdom



St. Ignatius of Antioch said *"I prefer death in Christ Jesus to power over the farthest limits of the earth. He who died in place of us is the one object of my quest. He who rose for our sakes is my one desire."* A disciple of the beloved Disciple John, he was consecrated Bishop around the year 69 by the Apostle Peter, the first Pope. A holy man who was deeply loved by the Christian faithful, he always made it his special care to defend "orthodoxy" (right teaching) and "orthopraxy" (right practice) among the early Christians.

In 107, during the reign of the brutal Emperor Trajan, he was sentenced to death because he refused to renounce the Christian faith. He was taken to Rome where he was to be brutally devoured by wild beasts. During his journey he made use of the time by writing letters of hope, instruction and inspiration to Christians. We still have these letters as a great treasure of the Church today. His writings, along with many

others that have been preserved and passed down to us, constitute the Tradition of the Church – teachings that come to us from the Apostles. His feast day is Monday, October 17th.

You Have Questions; We Have Answers.

We have a non-Catholic friend who went to Mass once with his Catholic girlfriend. As he looked around at the beauty of the church, he tripped over the girl when she stopped and genuflected before entering a pew. It caused a bit of a commotion among the assembly! “Why,” he asked us, “do you Catholics do that?” A good question, we thought. We make a lot of gestures out of the habits of a lifetime and, often, we don’t think about what we do or why we do it. We genuflect and make the sign of the Cross when we come before the Holy Eucharist – *the real presence of Jesus* – as a sign of our deep devotion, adoration, and respect for God Himself there in front of us. At St. Jerome’s, as at many Catholic churches, the tabernacle is obvious in the sanctuary and, therefore, *Jesus is right there!* A brief acknowledgement of Him is the least we can do. Many of us older members of St. Jerome’s simply aren’t able to fully genuflect – a deep bow, then, is appropriate. In the end, it is our attitude toward Our Lord that is important.
