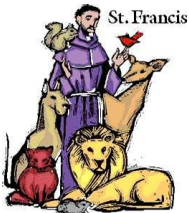

Words of Wisdom

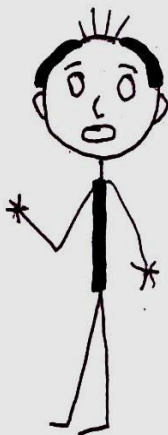

Most of the former atheists in this book had investigated religion’s claims to truth, rejected them—and were shocked to then find themselves turning to faith. These seekers ended up someplace they never intended to go—the Catholic Church—and yet went there and found that they were home. A quote from the book reads, “*I realized that sometimes God*

asks me to do things I don't understand—because he's my Father, and he said so. I can pray and study to better understand difficult issues, but sometimes God calls me to obedience before he calls me to greater understanding.”

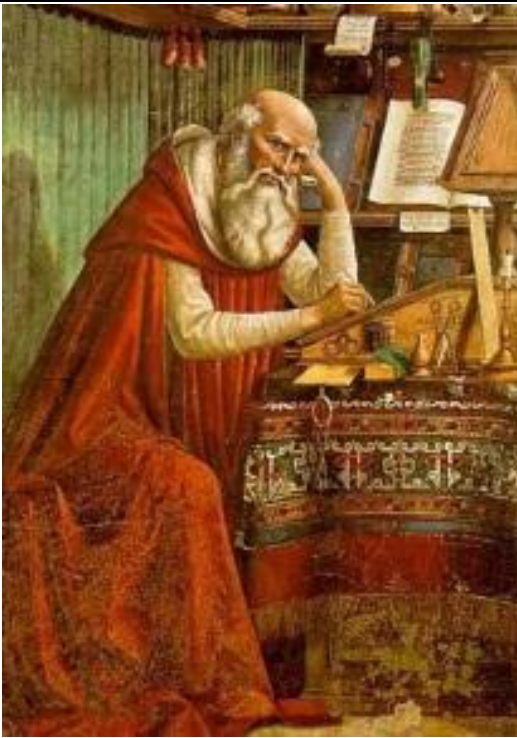

You Have Questions; We Have Answers. We have been asked how our church got its name. In short, Archbishop John Purcell (1800 – 1883) assigned the name in honor of one of his heroes – the Archbishop was, himself, quite a scholar and he admired scholarship in others, especially those who have done outstanding work. St. Jerome, who was born Eusebius Hieronymous Sophronius, was the most learned of the Fathers of the Western Church. He was born about the year 342 and his father, a Christian, took care that his son was well instructed at home, then sent him to Rome. What has made his name so famous was his critical labor on the text of the Scriptures. The **Church regards him as the greatest of all the doctors in clarifying the Divine Word.** St. Jerome died September 30, 420, and now lies somewhere in the Sistine Chapel. While his great work was the Vulgate Bible, his achievements in other fields are valuable, too; he was a pioneer in the field of Biblical archeology, his commentaries are

important; his letters, published in three volumes, are one of our best sources of knowledge of the times. His feast day was last Friday, September 30th.
