You Have Questions; We Have Answers. Next Saturday, October 15th is the Feast of St. Teresa of Jesus – usually known as St. Teresa of Avila. Why, people ask, is there such a widespread devotion to her? She was born March 28, 1515 and became a prominent Spanish mystic, Roman Catholic saint, Carmelite nun, writer of the Counter Reformation, and theologian of contemplative life through mental prayer. She was a reformer of the Carmelite Order and was a founder of the Discalced (shoeless) Carmelites. In 1622, forty years after her death, she was canonized by Pope Gregory XV, and in 1970 named a Doctor of the Church by Pope Paul VI. Her books, which include her autobiography, *The Life of Teresa of Jesus*, *The Interior Castle*, and *The Way of Perfection* are an integral part of Christian mysticism and Christian meditation practices. She died early in the morning of October 15, 1582. Her last words were: "My Lord, it is time to move on. Well then, may your will be done. O my Lord and my Spouse, the hour that I have longed for has come. It is time to meet one another."
