### Words of Wisdom

St. Leo the Great was born about 491 AD in Tuscany. He was Pope between 440 and 461. He persuaded Emperor Valentinian to recognize the primacy of the Bishop of Rome in an edict in 445 which was the beginning of separation of church and state. During his pontificate, he was able to quell several heresies about the divinity and humanity of Jesus. All secular historical treatises eulogize his efforts during the upheaval of the fifth century barbarian invasion when he persuaded Attila the Hun to turn back from the gates of Rome. When the Vandals occupied the city of Rome, he persuaded the invaders to desist from pillaging the city and harming its inhabitants. He died in 461, leaving many letters and writings of great historical value. His feast day is November 10th. One person, working humbly and with the grace of God, can achieve dramatic, perhaps miraculous, results.

### **You Have Questions; We Have Answers**

Must we receive Communion in the hand? Can't we receive on the tongue? You may, if you chose, receive Holy Communion on your tongue. Some people have suggested that their hands are "too dirty" to touch Jesus with them. But are our mouths all that clean? If you have spread gossip or cursed or blasphemed, your mouth may not be any cleaner than your hands! If you do receive in your hand, bow slightly in reverence of Christ's real presence, make a

"throne" with your dominant hand under the other and let the minister place the host in your palm – do not pluck it from him – then pick up the host with your lower hand and place it in your mouth and chew it. Remember that Jesus was a human and he knows you intimately.
