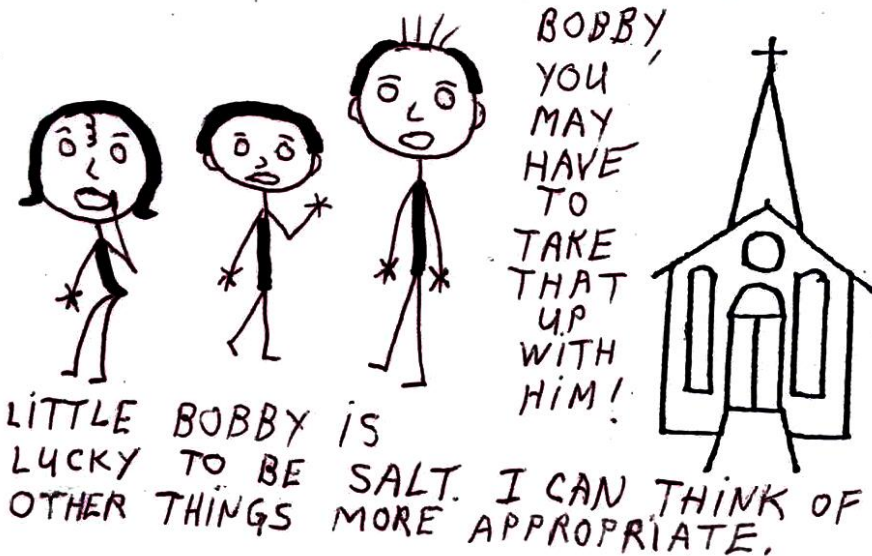
Words of Wisdom

Many of the words we pray during Mass will change beginning November 26th and 27th, 2011. We hope that many of you can attend the eight-week course on the Mass and the revisions and, afterwards, help us reach out to others in our community to help them make the transition.

You have questions; we have answers: There have been several editions or versions of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC)* beginning with the *Didaché* which was composed in the first century. After the Council of Trent in the 16th century, the famous *Catechism of Pius V* was printed. Much later, in the eighteenth century, the Baltimore Catechism was widely distributed and is still in print. More recently, the newest was printed and distributed in the United States in 1994 and remains today as an important guide to Catholic belief. Throughout the 2000 years, however, Catholic doctrine and dogmas have not changed. New insights and contemporary language have always meant updates and revisions to the book. The CCC is available in inexpensive paperback form and is a great addition to any Catholic home.

Mark your calendars: You can get a comprehensive **“Preventive Health Screening”** on Monday, February 28th at the American Legion Post 484 (1837 Sutton Avenue, Mt. Washington). .

Screenings will be offered that scan for potential health problems related to: blocked arteries, which is a leading cause of stroke; abdominal aortic aneurysms, which can lead to a ruptured aorta; hardening of the arteries in the legs, which is a strong predictor of heart disease; and atrial fibrillation or irregular heartbeat, which is closely tied to stroke risk. Register for the Stroke, Vascular Disease and Heart Rhythm Package for \$139. All four ultrasound screenings take 60-90 minutes to complete. Call 1-800-407-4557 to register.
