On Wednesday, March 23<sup>rd</sup>, Pope Benedict said that the modern world needs "zealous" disciples of Christ, who will fight religious indifference with the "light and beauty" of the Gospel. "Even today, the new evangelization needs well-trained, zealous and courageous apostles, so that the light and beauty of the Gospel may prevail over the cultural trends of ethical relativism and religious indifference," he said. This effort will help transform the various ways people think about life and help them act with an "authentic Christian humanism." The Pope dedicated his teaching at the Vatican to St. Lawrence of Brindisi, who was born in Italy in 1559 and was named one of the Doctors of the Church for his expertise in preaching Catholic doctrine and Sacred Scripture. **You have questions; we have answers:** We often read the stories within Holy Scripture and we enjoy them, but sometimes it can be very illuminating to dig a bit deeper into the meanings and backgrounds of those stories. For example, this weekend's Gospel was about the Samaritan woman at the well – it is a great story but it is fascinating when we realize that Jewish men were never to speak to unknown women, especially Samaritan women; also all Jews regarded Samaritan women as impure and were forbidden to drink from the same vessel one may have handled. Sometimes we need to be reminded that all people are God's children and that, by associating with all of them, we might bring the words of Jesus to them.
