Monday, April 18th, is **St. Jerome’s Lenten Penance Service** at 7:30 PM in church. There will be two priests to hear confessions.

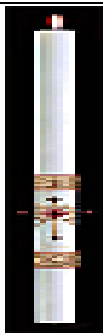

You Have Questions; We Have Answers: The lighting of the Paschal or Easter Candle is a tradition dating back to at least as early as the fourth century (“paschal” is a reference to the Passover). Churches were darkened during Holy Week; the Body of Christ was removed from the Tabernacle; and any remaining holy water was poured on the ground. Around midnight on Easter morning, the candle was lit from a bonfire (sometimes the bonfire was lit during the preceding day using the sun’s rays through a magnifying crystal). The candle thus symbolized the Light of Christ given to the World from heaven. It was carried into the church and all the lights were lit from it including the sanctuary lamp to prepare for the restoration of the Blessed Sacrament

back into the tabernacle. A font of water was blessed by immersing the base of the candle into it 3 times while a blessing prayer was said. This became the new holy water for the following year. If there were any baptisms to perform, they were done using the new water. The candle remained near the altar and was lit for every Mass until Ascension Day when it was removed – then brought out only for baptisms. Today we follow this tradition very closely. The five red points are wax molded into the shape of nails to remember Jesus’ wounds in His hands, feet, and side.
