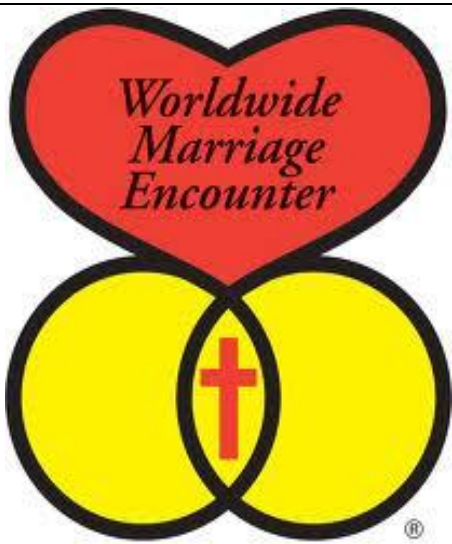

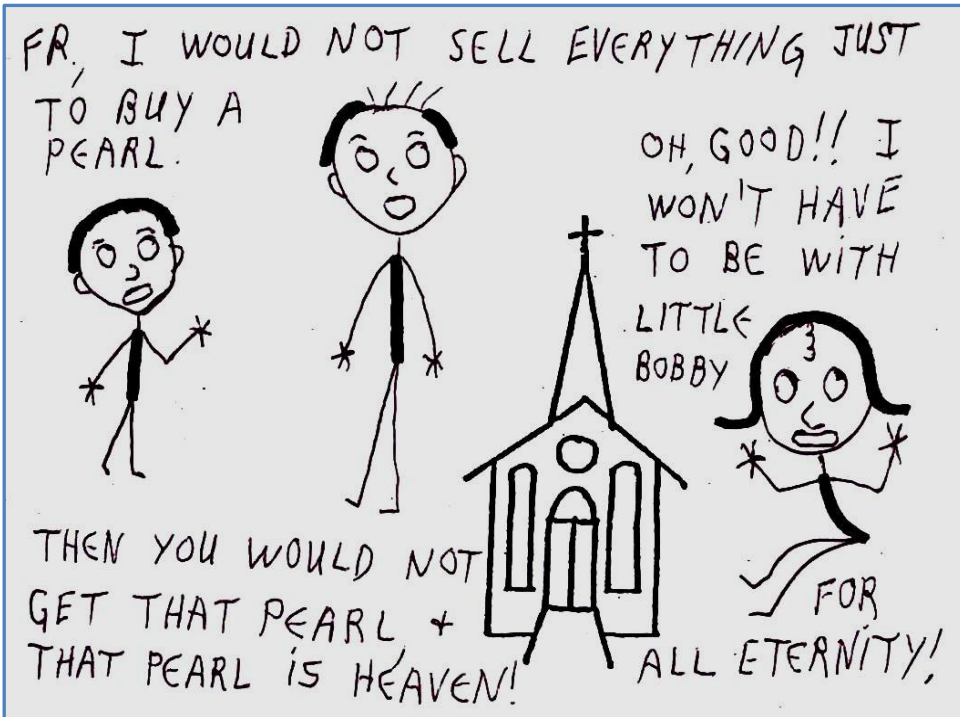
### Words of Wisdom

**"If Catholics were visibly 50 percent better than atheists at getting married, staying married and raising children, the culture would be transformed."**

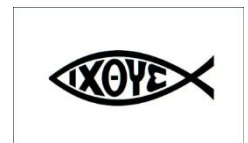

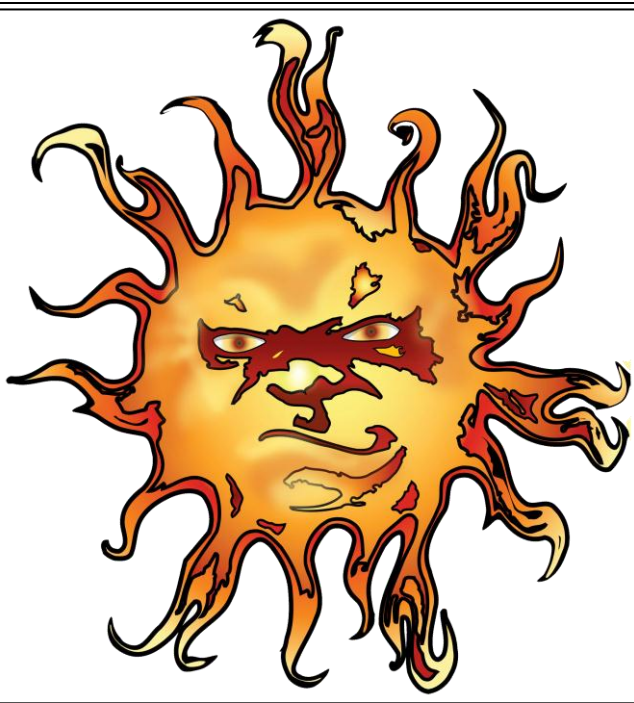
