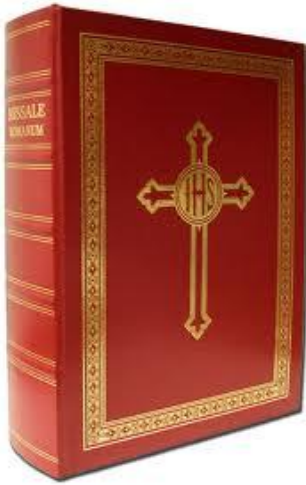

Words of Wisdom

The *Roman Missal* (also called the *Sacramentary*) is the big red book that the priest uses at the altar. It contains all the prayers, rituals, and instructions for every Mass. (There are two other books: The *Lectionary* which contains readings and Psalms and the *Book of the Gospels* which contains the four Gospels.) The American English version of the *Roman Missal* is changing for the first time since 1985. Some of the words we say during Mass are different and many of the prayers said by the priest are different. These changes will be effective on the first Sunday of Advent this year – November 26, 2011. Please watch for inserts in the bulletin which will help explain these changes as we get closer to Advent.

Monday, September 5th, is **Labor Day**. Please try to join us for Mass at 9:30 AM. Our country is facing some difficult trials with high unemployment and labor union issues – we should pray for our workers and our government leaders to help find solutions to our troubles.

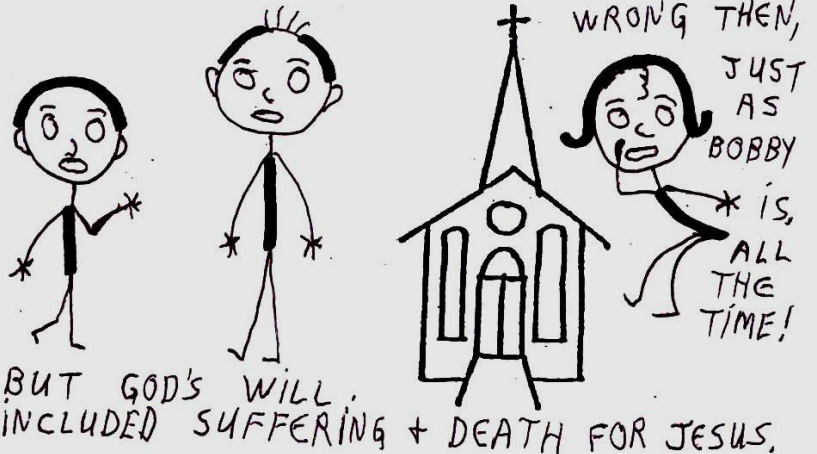

You Have Questions; We Have Answers:

As Catholics, we believe that it is right to pray for the dead. Judas Maccabeus, a general of the Jewish army (ca. 100 BC), went to bury some of his dead soldiers when he discovered that they were wearing medals dedicated to a false god – a major sin. He told his remaining soldiers to pray for the fallen ones that their “sin might be blotted out.” He also took up a collection which he sent to Jerusalem as a sin offering. (2



Maccabees 12:39-44.) We are blessed to have Purgatory – if God had not provided for the reparation of our sins, the only other choice would have been awful! We, too, can pray for friends and relatives who might be in Purgatory. **We can even have Masses said for them** – put \$5 in an envelope along with a note giving your name and the name of your loved one and drop it in the collection. (There are blank envelopes on the table by the front doors.)
